# **Project glossary**

<b>atlas</b> A collection of maps and information that shows the geographical features of an area.
<b>canal</b> A human-made waterway used to transport goods around the country.
cardinal point One of the four main points of the compass: north, east, south and west.
<b>climate</b> The general weather conditions found in a place over a period of time.
<b>compass</b> A hand-held device with a metal arrow that always points north, used for finding direction.
<b>continent</b> One of seven large land masses on Earth's surface, mainly surrounded by sea.
desert climate Very little rainfall and large temperature differences between night and day, and summer and winter.
<b>direction</b> The position towards which someone or something moves or faces.
<b>Earth</b> The planet in our solar system upon which we live.
<b>equator</b> A line of latitude around the middle of the Earth at 0°.
<b>fieldwork</b> Practical activities and investigations that are done away from school.





<b>four-figure grid reference</b> A method of locating a grid square on a map. The first two numbers show the horizontal position, and the second two numbers show the vertical position.
human feature A geographical feature created by humans, such as a road or a bridge.
intercardinal point One of the four compass points midway between the cardinal points: north-east, south-east, south-west and north-west.
map A drawing of part of the Earth's surface showing human and physical features.
Mediterranean climate A type of climate that has mild, wet winters and hot, dry summers.
<b>physical feature</b> A geographical feature that occurs naturally, such as a river or a mountain.
<b>polar climate</b> A type of climate that is cold and dry with long, dark winters.

### six-figure grid reference

A method of locating a specific point within a grid square on a map. The first three numbers, called the eastings, show the horizontal position and the second three numbers, called the northings, show the vertical position.

## temperate climate

A type of climate that has warm summers, cool winters, and year-round precipitation.

### tropical climate

A type of climate that has a constant hot temperature, and a wet season and dry season.
